The severity of our drought cannot be overstated! The risk it presents to our water supply and the threat of wildfires must be taken seriously by ALL. It is therefore imperative that each of us adheres to our current water restrictions and the complete ban on fireworks through December 31.

If you're like me, your sprinkler system might be a little tricky to adjust. If you haven't done so already, please set it to water ONLY on M/W/F or Tu/Th/Sa, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Failure to do so may result in fines, and eventual loss of irrigation water privileges. Continued broad-based abuse will likely result in the entire system being shut down before the end of the sea-

You've probably noticed the signs around town, announcing the citywide ban on fireworks. To restate the message, there will be zero tolerance for violators and expensive citations will be issued. This may seem a little grumpy, but another human-caused fire on our mountain is unacceptable.

Launching water balloon attacks on friends and neighbors seems like a more sensible alternative. Just make sure the skirmish takes place over the brown spots on your lawn!



WATER CONSERVATION

When Can I Water my Lawn?



Who do I call if want to request an exception to the watering days or times?

Please call 801-756-6347 to request an exception. Exception request are critically reviewed and are only granted on a very limited basis.

What are the fine for violation of watering restrictions?

First Offense: Warning

Second Offense: Pressurized irrigation service will be Locked.

A reconnection fee of \$50.00 will be required.

Third Offense & Future Offenses: Pressurized irrigation service will be Locked.

A reconnection fee of \$200.00 will be required.

Drought: Resources and Executive Order

On June 8th, 2021, Governor Cox issued his <u>third executive order</u> concerning Utah's extreme drought. In this order, Governor Cox calls upon local governments to implement outdoor water restrictions with an enforcement mechanism.
