GREEN WASTE DROP SITE CHANGES

The Logan City Environmental Department would like to make residents in Cache County aware of changes to the County green waste drop site collection services for the 2020 green waste season.

Beginning this year, containers will be placed at drop sites only in the spring and fall to accommodate seasonal green waste needs. The dates green waste drop sites will be available is April 6th through May 1st and October 5th through November 1st. Residents can still bring green waste to the Logan City Green Waste Facility located at 153 N 1400 W in Logan for free. This facility is open year-round, Monday through Saturday from 8 am to 5 pm. Curbside greenwaste collection service is also available for \$5 per month for residents in Hyde Park, Hyrum, Millville, Nibley, North Logan, Providence, River Heights, Smithfield, and Wellsville. Curbside green waste containers are emptied weekly from March 23rd through November 20th.

For more than 20 years Logan City Environmental Department has been able to provide this service for county residents for no charge to anyone. Unfortunately, when we evaluated growth, misuse of drop sites such as contamination and frequent use by commercial entities, and the associated escalating costs to provide drop site service from April to November we were led to the conclusion that we no longer have personnel, equipment, or funding to keep up with the demand.
