Message From Mayor Wheeler

On **November 9 from 6-9 pm Hyde Park will host an open house.** Please make some time in your schedule to attend. The purpose of this event is to gather input on many issues prior to a rewrite of the General Plan. In this effort we will address private property rights, affordable housing, open space, recreation areas like parks and trails, noise, traffic/transportation, and the city being financially sustainable.

We will discuss how development will or will not take place. Many come to the City desiring to do something with their property between Highway 91 and 2nd West, infill on lots in town, or something that will create new growth north, south, east or west of town. We will discuss lot size, and the dynamic that there are many who need and want to have housing that takes less work and that they can afford.

One of the most important and pressing issues is to address the relationship between water and growth.

This is an important opportunity for you to be able to make a difference. We will discuss ideas and plans for Hyde Park's future. We will be showing draft planning for the Wolf Pack Way road extension from the Green Canyon High School roundabout to Hyde Park Lane. Come and see pictures of our Mountain biking trail and the new water tank work and pipeline that is being accomplished. Ultimately this planning effort will change the General Plan for Hyde Park.

No parking on the street between 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.



- Where no curb and gutter exists, a vehicle must be parked 6 feet off the asphalt.
- Equipment or trailers must be removed.

The parking Ordinance applies during the entire 5 month period whether or not there is snow on the ground.

Proof of current rabies vaccination is required

Kennel Permit

If you have three or four dogs, a kennel permit is required.

- permit valid for 3 years
- cost to apply is \$55.00
